

This year's gathering was again successful, although the number of people attending was slightly down on last year. (Approximately 20). The interior of the hall was laid out in what has now become the traditional manner with tables positioned around the walls displaying family photographs suitably labelled to show who they were, the idea being to check to see if there were any family likenesses. Minutes of Annual General Meeting. Alderton Monday 6th May 1991.

- 1. Apologies for absence were received from:- Brenda Dixon, Rod Witheridge, Adam Cook, David and June Witheridge, Harry and Joan Payne, Philip Hookway and Paul and Kathy Witheridge.
- 2. The Minutes of the last A.G.M. on the 1st May, 1990, were accepted.
- 3. Matters Arising:- It was agreed that it should be made possible for members to order extra copies of the Magazine at cost price to send to relatives outside their immediate family.
- 4. Chairman's Report:- The Chairman stated that he was still finding it difficult to produce the Magazine on time. He had managed to get two copies out this year, even though one was very late. In future we should try to publish four copies as was agreed at our first meeting. He had received a letter from Kathy Witheridge in which she had agreed to be our representative covering the continent of North America. She had already introduced four new members.

There was one new application for membership from Australia. The Chairman said that he had published 38 copies of the Magazine in each volume, 12 of which went abroad. Our overseas membership was growing faster than the internal membership.

5. Secretary's Report:- The Secretary reported that we had joined the Guild of One Name Studies. He had compiled a list of Witheridges/Wetheridge from the telephone books throughout the country. 

Amendments to the Constitution of the Witheridge Society

<u>Sections of the Constitution discussed at the Annual General</u> Meeting:

4.1 Full membership. No change 4.2 Economy membership No change 4.3 Family membership No change

4.4 Overseas membership To read as follows:

This category will now allow membership as per paras 4.1 and 4.3, but will be cognisant of overseas postage rates.

NOTE: Categories 4.1 and 4.2 are for individuals only.

Voting rights are limited to those aged 16 years and over on the day a vote is taken.

5. Full membership

5.1 Subscriptions are to be renewed on the first day of January each year. Membership will be deemed to have lapsed if the subscription remains unpaid for five calendar months after the date of expiry.

NOTE: This will allow for the payment of the current year's subscriptions up to and including Witheridge Day each year. Any new member joining within the first eight months of the year will be deemed to have been a member for the full year and will pay subscription and receive all magazines and other benefits accordingly. Those joining in the last four months of the year will receive all benefits from that date, but their subscriptions, which are due immediately on joining, will be deemed to cover the full year from the next annual renewal date.

5.2 Advance Payment of Subscriptions

Advance payment will be allowed by overseas members. Three individual yearly subscriptions may be paid by a single payment. Each yearly subscription is to be at the rate current at the time the payment is made. The payment will be deemed to consist of one current year's subscription, and two years in advance. The advance payments will be placed on Bank deposit until each year's subscription is due.

Research Report

In this issue of the "Witheridge Times' you are witnessing a breakthrough in family tree production. For your delectation we offer you, not one, not two, but three magnificent specimens.

These trees have been produced on my word processor at a typed equivalent of three A4 sheets of paper side by side, or a width equivalent to 225 characters. Once produced on separate sheets they are sello-taped together and reprinted and rescaled to the size needed using my desk top copier with its zoom reduction and enlargement facilities. For the magazine, trees are produced at A4 size or 21x30cm. For framing and display, the trees can be produced up to A3 sheet size or 30x42cm. Look at these trees, I defy you to find the join, as the toupee salesman said to the bald headed man. I can also enhance the trees using pictures, photographs and drawings, I can use different print colours, red, brown, green, and the normal black, I can also use coloured and textured paper to make the final print look like parchment.

Well I've given you the sales pitch, now let's get on with this research report.

The Tavistock Witheridge Family Tree.

Now I can hear you saying "didn't we get that one two issues of the magazine ago?" (ie. Vol.4 No.1.) Well you are right, but I made a mess of that last one. I had my knuckles rapped, by you know who! It appears I'm using too much imagination and too little fact.

Kim has passed on some more information. Also, she has been searching for Witheridges in the Tavistock area census returns and although her work here is not complete, she has however, found and passed on some useful detail. In addition to this the Society now has another four marriage certificates relevant to the Tavistock Tree. The new tree is at the rear of this magazine on a fold out sheet.

We have now obtained the certificates for the two marriages in 1861 and 1863, involving Richard Witheridges.

On the 15th September 1861 Richard Witheridge, aged 26, bachelor, labourer of Lamerton, whose father was John Witheridge, a road man, married Mary Ann Hatherly, aged 22, spinster, of Tavistock, whose father was Thomas Hatherly, labourer.

This means that Polly b1863, and the daughter of Richard and Mary Ann Hatherly, was the grand-daughter of John Witheridge of Lamerton, a labourer on the roads.

On the 30th June 1863, another Richard Witheridge, of full age, bachelor, butcher, of Whitchurch, whose father was Samuel Witheridge, yeoman, married Eliza Chowen, also of full age, spinster, of Whitchurch, whose father was Richard Chowen, yeoman.

This marriage links the births of Richard Chowen and Henry Chowen Witheridge, the sons of Richard and Eliza Chowen, to the Whitchurch family and their grand-father Samuell, yeoman of Whitchurch.

We also have the marriage certificate for William bc1828 of the Whitchurch family. On 20th February 1854 in the Parish church of Buckland Monachorum, Devon, William Witheridge of full age, bachelor, farmer, of Whitchurch, whose father was Samuell Witheridge, Farmer, married Cecilia Maria Connabeer, aged 20, spinster, of Buckland Monachorum, whose father was Samuel Connabeer, Yeoman.

Also of interest on this certificate are the witnesses, Samuel and Elizabeth Witheridge. Samuel , William's brother was not married at this time and so this Elizabeth appears to be a sister and not Samuel's wife. The census searches give Samuel's wife as Mary, and also shows that there was another sister, Mary Ann, b1842 (T).

You will also see additions at the top of the tree. From a death certificate of 1838, we realise that we have another William, born c1758, who was the father of Mary, and could be father to others. Also added is a Thomas Witheridge, Excise Officer, born in Tavistock, circa 1758, who lived in Birmingham and the Derby area, and some of his descendants lived in the London area. We have the marriage certificate for 22nd July 1850 when William Witheridge married Hannah Lee. William's father is given as Thomas Witheridge, Excise Officer. There are possibly two daughters born of this marriage, Emily Lee, b1852, and Helen, b1853, both in the district of Shoreditch. Also we should mention that this William, a carpenter, is mentioned in Betsy Minhinnick Witheridge's will. Betsy is his elder sister.

Well that is enough about this family for the moment, but you will have seen that I've enhanced this tree with a picture of Buckland Abbey, why?, you may well ask. Well I'll tell you. Some of the Tavistock Witheridges, William and his brother Thomas, the sons of Samuell and Mary, née Atwill, were farming Whistleigh Farm, in the Parish of Buckland Monachorum. This parish was named after the Cistercian Abbey founded there in 1278, and is about a mile to the west of Whistleigh Farm. The ruins of this original abbey can still be seen, and together with the adjacent but more recent Des. Res. (desirable residence) Buckland Abbey, are now under the protection of the National Trust.

Some of the original buildings of the Abbey were converted into this country house, as the picture shown on the Tavistock tree, around the mid 1500's. It was owned at that time by the Grenville family. Sir Richard Grenville bought the Abbey in 1541, his son, Roger, was the commander of the ill fated Mary Rose which sank with all hands in 1545. The estate passed to Roger's son, another Sir Richard Grenville, who was caught by a number of Spanish Ships and is noted for his determined fight to the end in 'The Revenge'. He died later of his wounds. Sir Richard had already sold Buckland Abbey to Sir Francis Drake in 1581 but Drake died on the Spanish Main in 1596, and was 'Slung atween the round shot in Nombre Dios Bay, an' dreamin' arl the time o' Plymouth Hoe.' Thomas Drake, Francis's brother was with Drake when he died, and Thomas brought home to England Drake's drum, which is on display in Buckland Abbey today.

This is not stictly Witheridge history but I thought it would interest you just the same. The Grenville family also had links with the area of our next Witheridge Family Tree. They owned land in Bideford from Norman times, an interest which they retained until 1744.


The Bideford Witheridge Family Tree.

Whilst I was in the middle of preparing this magazine for publication a letter from Alice and Percy Alfred Witheridge, who live in Kallaroo, Western Australia, dropped through my letter box. The small envelope containing the letter was crammed full of information relating to Australian Witheridges who were involved in World War 1. You will no doubt have noted on the Tavistock Tree that I showed Percy's Uncle, Alfred Richard was killed in action 25.10.1917.

What really effected me, and I have to tell you I cried, was the sacrifice from the family of Harry and Annie Elizabeth Witheridge. Of four sons who went to war, only one, Harold Hinley Witheridge came home again to Australia. (See the Bideford Tree above the place key)

There is also information relating to the Combmartin and Berrynarbor family, about Robert, who lost an arm and a leg, and Thomas who was killed in action 2.3.1917. These Witheridges were the sons of Philemon Witheridge b1846.

This reminded me of Kim's article in Vol.1 No.2/3, 'We Will Remember Them', and also George Smith's article in Vol.2 No.1, 'Remembering'. It wasn't long before I had built this tree by extending Kim's tree, using the membership details of related members, and some nifty fitting together of the early pieces of this jig-saw from the IGI, around Abbotsham, Bideford, Littleham, and Northam.



I'll leave you with this tree, and the thought that each life lived has a small but lasting effect on the future. The picture of Bideford Bridge, embellishing this tree is a case in point. Before this bridge was built in the early 1500's there was a wooden bridge here crossing the river Torridge. This earlier wooden bridge was used as the framework for the construction of the stone bridge and so the stone arches inherited the varying arch widths of the timber bridge which had been determined by the original carpenters and the timber beam lengths they had available to use all those years before.

The Camberwell Wetheridges.

On Witheridge Day we had a fleeting visit by three Wetheridges, Mr Michael Wetheridge, his wife and son. There are not many of our families who still use the early spelling of our surname. One group who are more persistent than the rest of us live in the London area. We call this group of families 'The Camberwell Wetheridge's'. We've constructed a rather imaginative tree around them (see pages 12 and 13). We started working on this tree in the back end of last year, and in an attempt to explore the origins of these families we have recently acquired two of the earliest marriage certificates.

It appears that on February 8th 1859, a William Wetheridge aged 26, (birth circa 1833) married Jane Alford. William's father is given as James Wetheridge, plumber. This marriage certificate is witnessed by a James Wetheridge (father?) and a Caroline Wetheridge.

On February 15th 1869, almost ten years later to the day, Charles Edward Wetheridge aged 20, (birth circa 1849) married Louisa Jane Goodwin. Charles's father is given also as James Wetheridge, plumber. It looks as though William and Charles Edward were brothers. The witnesses to this marriage were William Wetheridge (brother?) and Eliza Wetheridge. Just look at the difference in age of these two brothers, 26 years. Which makes us ask the question did their father marry twice, and were they half brothers.

We still have no idea where these Wetheridges were born or where their father James, plumber, lived and died. Perhaps in the census returns for Camberwell in the years 1861 and 1871 we will be able to find these two brothers living with their young families. If we find them we will also find out where they were born.

That's all we have room for in this magazine, but if you see an error or an omission or you have an idea of how we can improve our presentations please get in touch.

Affiliation to the Guild of One Name Studies

by John Witheridge

As some of you will know by now, we have joined the 'Guild of One Name Studies' so that we may be able to widen our horizons and study some of the families who have married into our line through the centuries. It also means that we will be sharing our expertise with any member of the Guild who requires data concerning the Witheridge/Wetheridge families. It should be a good interchange where each Society could gain from the other.

HOW does it work?

Any member of the Guild can write to me and ask for details of our family trees, etc. This can only be a good thing for us, because if Guild members are interested in our families, then they probably have information which would be of interest to our members.

- If you have a surname that you want to investigate then telephone or write to me and we will look for the name in the Guild register. If the name is in the Guild register then we take the next step.
- 1. You post a letter to me, listing all the questions and data that you wish me to pass on.
- 2. With this letter I require three stamps and three envelopes, the first of which is to be self addressed, the second is for me to post to the Guild member, and the third is for the return to me of any information the Guild may have.

There is one variation to this. In the case of the Guild member who is to be contacted living abroad, one of the stamps must be sufficient to cover the charge of postage to the particular country, and the third stamp should be replaced with three international reply coupons. The idea behind this system is that the member supplying the data does not pay for any postage, only the person requiring the information has to foot the bill.

The register I shall be working from is upgraded several times each year. I shall be keeping a record of your enquiries, and should a name not be on the Guild's list but be added at a later date, I will inform you. The current list of names registered with the Guild is given on the next two pages numbers 22 and 23, and also details of some publications relating to the Guild of One Name Studies and to the Federation of Family History Societies are given inside the rear cover.




The Bideford Witheridge Family Tree
