2 Witheridge Deaths.

We were sorry to learn of the death of John Michael Witheridge of Kent. John was the youngest of three children born to Sidney Philip Witheridge (Ermington branch), and his wife Winifred Emily Frederica Lund. For many years John and his wife Mayda were members of WFHS, holding a number of Committee posts, and John attended many WFHS meetings. However, as John's family history interests widened, he switched to supporting other family history groups. He was a very active member of the Friends of Medway Archives (FOMA) and became their Vice-Chairman.

Although retired for many years, in his working life John was a builder who specialised in restoring historic buildings. We understand that, early in December, John had a fall and was admitted to hospital. There it was discovered that he had advanced cancer, and he died on 15 December 2014. We send our condolences to Mayda and all the family.

On 31st January, Barbara Finemore received an e-mail from Richard Home, the son of Lorna Home (#204), advising us of the recent death of his mother. Apart from the fact that Lorna lived in Merseyside, UK, I have not so far been able to gain any further details as to how she linked in to the Witheridge family. 5. NEWS FROM CANADA



Kathy Witheridge - (#60) - Canada

Just before Christmas I received an e-mail from Kathy, encouraging me to have a look at a Canadian journal website where I could read about the basis of the above picture. Thought you would like me to share what I discovered with the rest of the Witheridge family. Here is a summary of the narrative concerning the medal proudly worn by Kathy.

The picture shows Kathy wearing a medal she received in November which was awarded to her for surviving with Type 1 Diabetes for 50 years. On one side the medal reads, "Triumph for Man and Medicine". The other side says, "For 50 courageous years with diabetes". Kathy was a young woman aged 22, living in Halifax, West Yorkshire, UK, when she learned that she had diabetes. The presentation of this medal was launched in 1970 by the Boston Joslin Diabetes Clinic. The programme was started by Dr Elliott Joslin who believed that proper self-management was the key to minimizing complications. Since 1970 only 2,905 50-year medals have been presented to recipients around the world since 1970.

Kath has always maintained strict self-discipline in order to ensure that as far as possible, her life would not be dominated by her illness. Despite being aware of the potential difficulties, Kathy gave birth to a healthy son and she and her husband, Paul, went on to become great-grandparents.

Dr. Joslin wanted the presentation of 50 year medals to serve as an incentive to all Type 1 Diabetics. Kathy shares his belief, "I have had to be disciplined - the only thing I'm supposed to do, that I don't do enough, is exercise!!"

Our sincere congratulations to you Kathy. Maybe they will have to think about casting a medal to commemorate another ??? years!!

It is free from the UK - a small fee from Overseas, but much better than an overseas cheque.
