Message from the Chairman

Happy New Year to all our members! Hopefully 2022 will be a better year than 2021 was.

Firstly, let me apologise that there have been no newsletters or information in the last few months. This is primarily because there has been nothing to report! The issues that the whole world have been facing as a result of Covid are largely to blame, however there is one bit of news that does need to be put in black and white.

Further to the Virtual AGM held last year, most of you will have seen the minutes, and be aware of the decision that has been made. Constitutionally, we are duty bound to report the outcome of all meetings in the Society's publication to its members, however, I did not want to send out a newsletter with that as the overriding bulk of content, hence the delay in publication.

After almost 35 years, the Committee felt it necessary to wind the Society up. There were several factors involved in making the decision, which I will attempt to explain to you here. It was not a decision that was taken lightly, but by the same token, we felt that there was no other option.

All the Committee functions have historically been voluntary (and therefore unpaid) positions. However, in recent years, there has been no one willing to take on the role of Secretary/Newsletter Editor, so the Society have had to make it effectively a paid position. Whilst the honorarium that Amy has received has been very modest (and she has done excellent work for us!), it has been sufficient to over stretch the Society's limited resources. Although we were forced to increase the subscription cost in 2021 (for the first time since the Society's inception), it wasn't enough to solve the problem. Subscriptions would have needed to be raised significantly in 2022 as well, and it was felt that our membership would no longer be getting value for money.

This has also been compounded by the membership numbers gradually dwindling as members leave the Society, with no new young blood coming in to replace them. Given the ease of access to information on the internet, (which hasn't been readily available until the last 10-15 years), there is no incentive for people to pay to join a society, when their computer allows them to do it for free.

Both of these issues have been focal points of Committee discussions over the last few years, without them requiring imminent and drastic action. It was always hoped that we would be able to find a solution to the problem before it got urgent. However, we were unable to do so. Furthermore, the passing of our Founder, Kim Cook, left a great hole. The knowledge and enthusiasm she brought to the Society could not be easily replaced, even had we been able to find someone willing to volunteer to take over the role she performed.

Therefore, this will be the last Witheridge Society newsletter. I did not want to go out on a note of doom and gloom, which is why I asked everyone to send in festive pictures from Christmas 2021. Hopefully they will provide you with some enjoyment.

Thank you to everyone that has supported the Society over the years.
